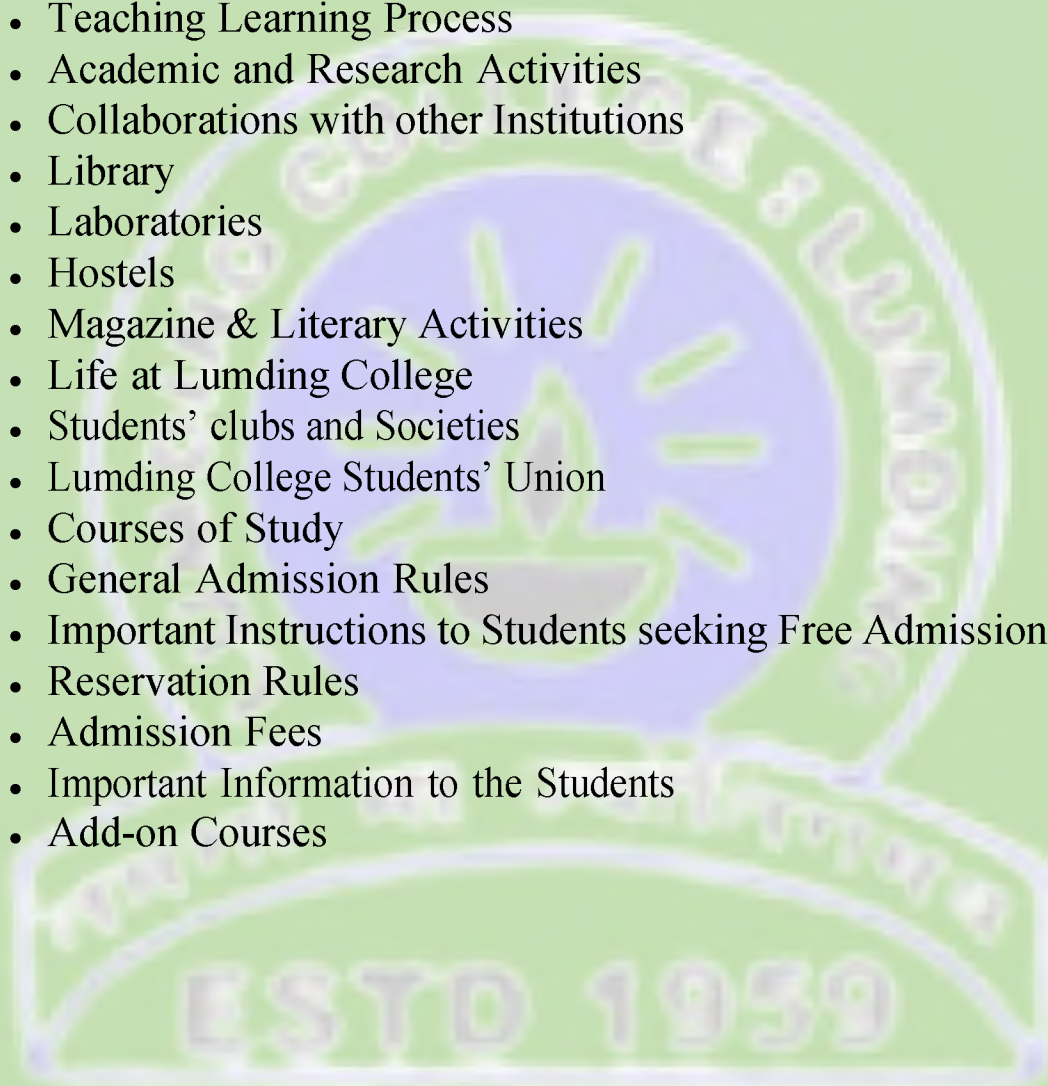

The College

Lumding College, located in the heart of Lumding Town in the Hojai District of Assam, stands as one of the oldest educational institutions in this remote region. Founded on August 14, 1959, by a group of forward-thinking educators, patriots, and philanthropists with a vision for advancing higher education in Lumding, the College has weathered numerous challenges since its inception to attain its current standing. On December 1, 1972, the College came under the Deficit System of Grant-in-Aid by the Government of Assam, and it was Provincialized by the same Government on December 1, 2005.

Presently, Lumding College provides Higher Secondary Education along with Four-Year Degree (FYUGP) Programmes across three disciplines: Arts, Science, and Commerce. The institution is affiliated with the Assam Higher Secondary Education Council (AHSEC), and Gauhati University (GU), and is going to be affiliated with Rabindranath Tagore University (RTU) too for these respective Courses. Additionally, it offers various Professional and Self-Financed Programmes. With an enrolment exceeding 2000 students from diverse backgrounds, the College fosters a dynamic atmosphere in its campus. Under the guidance of dedicated faculty members, students have consistently excelled in both academic pursuits and extracurricular activities. Notably, the College has produced graduates who have achieved top honours in their final examinations.

In 2004, Lumding College received accreditation from the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) with a B+ Grade. In the subsequent Cycle II, the College underwent reaccreditation by NAAC in 2018, achieving a B Grade. Furthermore, in 2019, it was elevated to the status of a Model Degree College by the Rashtriya Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA). The institution places significant emphasis on enhancing the quality of higher education by catering to the needs and aspirations of each student. It boasts spacious classrooms, well-equipped science laboratories, a language lab, an extensive library with internet access, a dedicated departmental library, complimentary Wi-Fi, an air-conditioned seminar hall, a central computer room, a Northeast Heritage Centre, a two-story girls' hostel, well-appointed separate common rooms for male and female students, and a hygienic canteen. Additionally, it offers ample facilities for sports and games, provision for safe drinking water, and a vehicle shed. Efforts are currently underway to construct smart classrooms to facilitate advanced teaching and learning methodologies.

The Lumding College community is mindful of individuals who may have been unable to pursue higher education for various reasons. In response, the college has established a study center in collaboration with K.K. Handique State Open University.

The Campus

Located in the heart of Lumding Town, the College Campus provides a secure and welcoming environment for students. Situated amidst local communities closely affiliated with the institution, the campus is enclosed by boundary walls and guarded by security personnel stationed at all entry and exit points. Students are required to wear college uniforms and carry valid identification cards issued by the

institution upon entering the premises. Additionally, visitors must register their names and purpose of visit at the college gates to prevent unauthorized access. The College Administration has implemented closed-circuit cameras throughout the campus to maintain constant surveillance and ensure student safety. The college's infrastructure comprises various buildings and blocks spread across the campus.

Administrative Building

The Administrative Building houses the Principal's Chamber, Office, Digital Classroom, Conference Hall, Girls' Common Room, and several Academic Departments.

Library Block

This block encompasses the Central Library, Biotech Hub, some of the Academic Departments, and Laboratories for certain Science Departments.

Science Block

This block features the Department of Chemistry, Physics, Botany and classrooms designated for Science Departments.

RUSA Building

This building is under construction where a digital classroom, digital conference hall, and gymnasium hall are proposed to contain.

Teaching Learning Process

Since its establishment, Lumding College has adhered to a student-centric academic philosophy, dedicated to nurturing and empowering young minds while offering unparalleled learning opportunities. The institution is committed to employing quality teaching methods to cater to the diverse backgrounds and abilities of its student body. In addition to traditional teaching approaches, the college integrates ICT tools, e-resources, and experiential and participative learning methods to enhance the overall learning experience.

With a team of experienced and proficient faculty members across various fields, Lumding College not only imparts academic knowledge but also encourages students to engage in cultural, literary, sports, and other extracurricular activities to foster holistic personality development. Faculty members serve as mentors to students, providing guidance and support to ensure their intellectual and emotional well-being. The college maintains a transparent system of internal assessment and evaluation.

Every faculty member at Lumding College is deeply engaged in research endeavors. Collectively, they have contributed over 300 research papers to esteemed national and international journals. Currently, some faculty members serve as Ph.D. guides at different universities. The College boasts of well-equipped seminar halls for facilitating such events. Despite the challenges posed by the COVID-19 pandemic, the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) and various departments of the college organized numerous online seminars and webinars during the last few academic years and are still continuing with blended modes till date to ensure continued academic engagement and enrichment.

Library

The Lumding College Library stands out as one of the premier college libraries in Assam, offering efficient services to its readers and serving as a hub of attraction for students. With a focus on complementing the knowledge imparted by teachers, the library boasts of a vast collection of resources, including over 25,000 texts and reference books and a diverse array of local and national newspapers, journals, maps, and globes. It provides a dedicated reading room for students and allocates space exclusively for teachers.

Upon admission, every student receives a library card enabling them to borrow books and journals, facilitating the expansion of their knowledge and experience. Moreover, the college is registered under the N-LIST programme through the UGC-Inflibnet Digital Library Consortium. Additionally, each department maintains a departmental library, granting students and teachers access to specialized resources.

Operating on an open access system, the Lumding College Library eliminates barriers between books and readers, allowing students' direct access to the wealth of knowledge preserved within its stacks.

Library Timings

Access to book lending facility: 11 AM to 3 PM on all working days till Admit Cards for Final Examination are issued.

The library rules are as follows

- The library card is valid till the end of the session every year, subject to further renewal, if all the conditions are fairly fulfilled by the holder.
- A fine of Rs. 50/- will be levied if the card is lost.
- Books will be issued only for 7 (Seven) days after which fine will be charged at the rate of Rs. 2/- per day.
- This card entitles the holder to borrow two books in H.S. course and four books in TDC course.
- This card is not transferable

Important Note: The library regulations are prominently displayed within the library premises, and students and library members must adhere strictly to these rules and regulations as stipulated by the Librarian. The College Librarian retains the authority to suspend the library membership of any student or member found to violate these rules.

Hostel

The college provides a Girls' hostel within proximity to the campus, catering to the needs of students hailing from remote areas. With a capacity to accommodate 30 students, the hostel comprises 12 well-furnished rooms, each capable of housing 3 boarders.

Boarders enjoy access to various facilities including medical care, yoga and meditation classes, library resources, indoor games, and community television. To foster holistic development, outdoor activities such as city tours, educational trips, and picnics are organized periodically.

The hostels maintain a strict policy against ragging and any form of harassment, fostering a safe and inclusive environment. Drawing students from diverse regions of North East India, the hostels serve as a melting pot of cultures. For efficient management, a Hostel Supervision Committee oversees hostel affairs and formulates rules and regulations.

Eligibility for hostel accommodation

- Only regular students of the College are eligible for hostel accommodation.
- Admission to the hostel is purely first come first.
- The admission to the hostel will be finalized by the admission committee.

Hostel Admission Procedure

All HS/UG first-year students desiring hostel accommodation should apply to the respective Hostel Superintendent in the prescribed form (forms available on the college website). The following documents must be attached to the completed application form at the time of submission:

- College admission receipt.
- Permanent Resident Certificate (PRC).
- Two passport-size photographs.
- Copy of mark sheet.

The College Authority reserves the right to refuse or cancel admission to a candidate without assigning any reason. The decision of the College Authority is final and binding.

Lumding College Students' Union (LCSU)

The College has a students' union under the name, Lumding College Students' Union (LCSU). Every student of the college is a member of the society. The office bearers are elected annually by the students through direct election conducted as per the guidelines laid down by the Supreme Court of India. The Students' Union organizes Freshers' Social, Annual College Week, Cultural Functions, Debates, Literary Activities, Social Service Activities, etc. The Union publishes the College magazine, annually, to which students and teachers contribute their creative writings.

Students' Welfare Fund

This fund provides financial help to economically backward and meritorious students. Applications for financial aid are invited. The applications submitted by the students should be accompanied with income certificate of parents given by competent authority. A committee is formed by the Principal to consider the applications received and to prepare a list of deserving students.

NSS (National Service Scheme)

The National Service Scheme (NSS) Unit of Lumding College is rendering commendable work by encouraging students to cherish dignity of labour and reverence for the composite Indian Culture through its regular Personality Development Programmes and other special camping activities.

Yoga and Meditation Centre

The College has established a Yoga and Meditation Centre to popularize the art of Yoga and Meditation among the students. In order to make this endeavour more fruitful the College has signed a MoU with Vivekananda Kendra Institute of Culture (VKIC) in the Year 2022 which has been instrumental in popularizing Yoga among youth in the country.

Xerox cum Stationary Corner

Located at an easily accessible area inside the college premises, this corner provides stationery and other necessary items for students. Photocopy and DTP facilities are also available for students and employees of the college at a reasonable rate.

Career Guidance and Placement Cell (CGPC)

The College has set up a Career Guidance and Placement Cell to provide information and to organize programmes highlighting career opportunities in different fields. It also organizes Campus Recruitment Drives in which students get job opportunities during their stay in the college.

Right to Information Cell

In compliance with the RTI Act 2005, the College has constituted the RTI Cell of which the Principal is the First Appellate Authority. The aim of RTI is to promote transparency and accountability in official matters.

Educational Tours

Most of the academic departments of the College organize educational tours, field visit, and excursions to different parts of India with the idea of exposing students to the culture, history, geography, advanced research laboratories, libraries and national parks of India.

Canteen

The college has two canteens, which remain open during the class hours. These are under the supervision of a committee constituted by the Principal. Different food and beverage items are provided at reasonable rates. Groups of students thronging at the canteen are a common sight. The canteen provides the much-needed space to students for recreation and community building.

NOTE:

- i) Statistics is not allowed without Mathematics.
- ii) Statistics-Geology combination is not allowed.
- iii) It is desirable that students intending to offer Physics/Chemistry as elective subjects offer Mathematics also as one of the elective subjects.
- iv) Additional Subjects will not be allowed to those who have secured less than 40 % marks on aggregate in HSLC or equivalent exam.
- v) A student can offer a maximum of four elective subjects as his / her combination, but the subject in which he/she secures the lowest marks in the Final Examination would be treated as his / her 4th subject and no marks of it would be credited to better his / her results.
- vi) It is advisable that all those who intend to pursue the H.S. Course in commerce offer Economics as one of their optional subjects in their future interest.
- vii) Students in the HS-1st Year will have to study Environmental Education as a compulsory subject.

New Education Policy 2020 and its implementation under Rabindranath Tagore University

Our Government paved the way for transformative reform in the school and higher education system by launching the New National Education Policy (NEP) on 29th July 2020. The Committee for Draft National Education Policy headed by Dr. K. Kasturirangan submitted its report on May 31, 2019. The Committee was constituted by the Ministry of Human Resource Development in June 2017. The draft Policy provides for reforms at all levels of education from school to higher education. It seeks to increase the focus on early childhood care, reform the current exam system, strengthen teacher training, and restructure the education regulatory framework. It also seeks to set up a National Education Commission, increase public investment in education, strengthen the use of technology, and increase focus on vocational and adult education, among others.

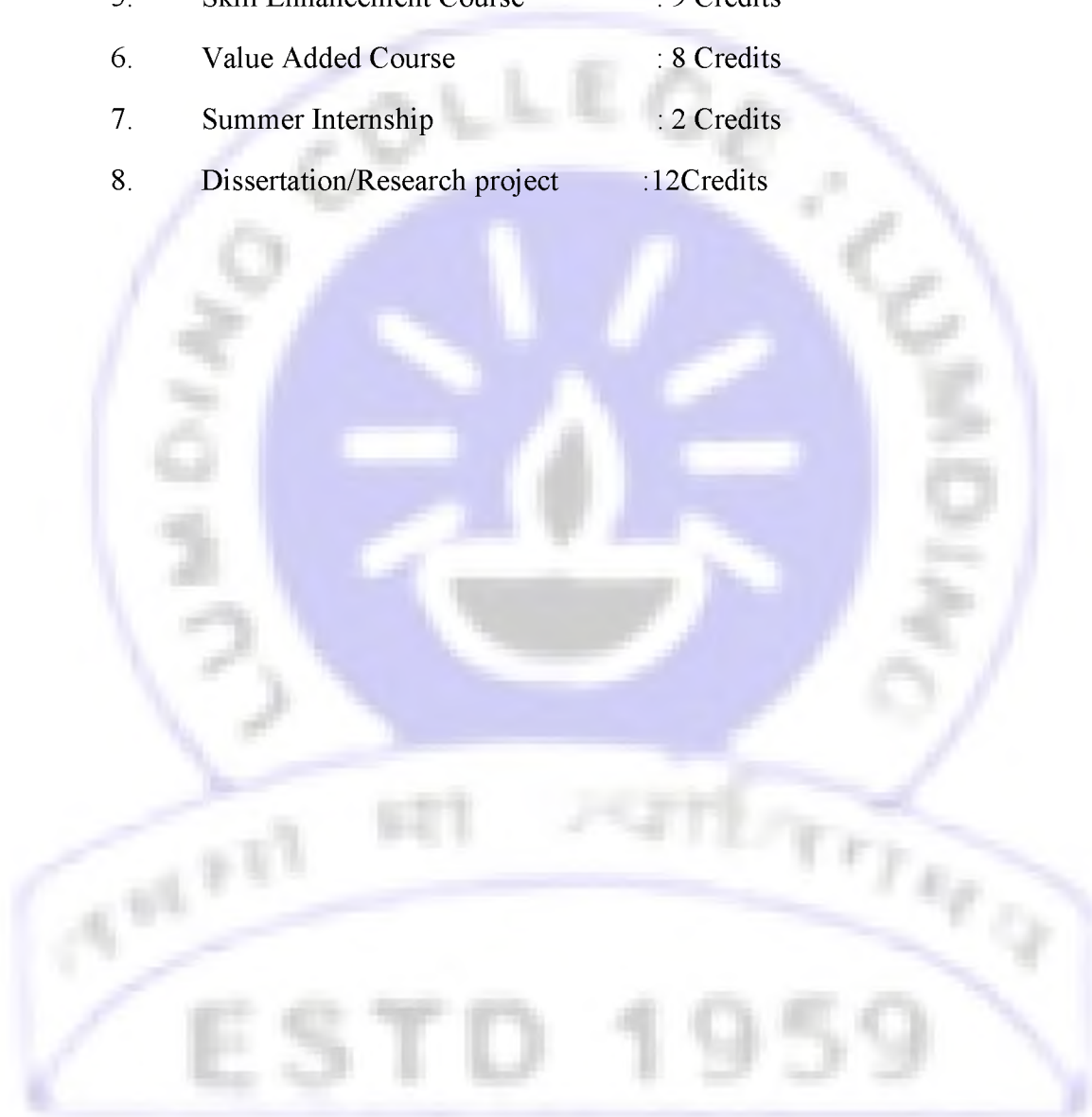
In accordance with the NEP 2020, the UGC has formulated a new student-centric “Curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programmes (CCFUP)” incorporating a flexible choice-based credit system, multidisciplinary approach, and multiple entry and exit options. This will facilitate students to pursue their career path by choosing the subject/field of their interest.

Accordingly, Lumding College has adopted Four Year Undergraduate Course Curriculum Framework (FYUGCF) under New Education Policy, 2020 which has been implemented from August 2023. It is a structure for Four-Year Undergraduate Programmes in different disciplines with multiple exit options.

Outline of Courses:

The categories of courses and requirements of minimum credits for 4-Year Degree as per UGC are as follows:

1. Major/Core (DSC) : 80 Credits
2. Minor/DSE : 32 Credits
3. Multidisciplinary (GE) : 9 Credits
4. Ability Enhancement Course : 8 Credits
5. Skill Enhancement Course : 9 Credits
6. Value Added Course : 8 Credits
7. Summer Internship : 2 Credits
8. Dissertation/Research project : 12 Credits

IMPORTANT POINTS

1. A student who opts to exit after completion of 1st Year securing 40 credits may be awarded a UG Certificate, if s/he completed one vocational course of 4 credits during summer vacation of first year.
2. A student who opts to exit after completion of 2nd Year securing 80 credits may be awarded a UG Diploma, if s/he completed one vocational course of 4 credits during summer vacation of second year.
3. A student who opts to exit after completion of either 1st Year or completion of 2nd Year may be allowed to re-enter within 3rd Years and complete the degree programme within the stipulated maximum period of seven years.
4. A student who opts to exit after completion of third year securing 120 credits will be eligible for UG degree with Major discipline without Honours.
5. For 4-Year Honours degree the major subject/discipline requires 80 credits and the minor subject/discipline requires 32 credits. The student who exits after completion of 6th Semester/3rd Year, s/he requires 60 credits in the major subject/discipline and 24 credits in the minor subject/discipline.
6. Students who intend to complete four year degree programme will have two options in 7th and 8th semester as:
 - i) Students who choose Research in 4th year are to study DSC-16, DSC-17, and DSC-18 of 4 credits each and to complete a dissertation/project of 4 credits mandatorily in 7th semester. Accordingly, in 8th semester these students will study DSC-19, DSC-20 of 4 credits each and to complete a dissertation/project of 8 credits.
 - ii) Students who don't choose Research will study DSC-21*, DSC-22*, DSC-23* mandatorily in lieu of dissertation/project in 7th and 8th semester in addition to (DSC-16 to DSC-20) leading to Honours without Research.
7. Students who completed four-year degree programme with dissertation/project will be awarded Bachelor Degree of Honours with Research. And students who completed four year degree without dissertation/project will be awarded Bachelor Degree of Honours.

Choosing of Courses/Papers

The students seeking admission into B.A., B. Sc., and B.Com. programmes are to choose the course/papers as per the following guidelines. The students will choose minor, multidisciplinary, SEC, AECC, and VAC papers based on the Core paper they opted. The details of basket/grouping are made for B. A., B. Sc, and B.Com as below. Opting for a Major/Minor is subject to the availability of the seats in the concerned departments.

INTAKE CAPACITY:

All admissions to Higher Secondary First Year and FYUGP First Semester in Lumding College shall be in accordance with Uniform Policy of Admission of Students into the Colleges in different Streams of Government and Provincialised Colleges of Assam vide Govt. of Assam O.M. No.AHE.250/2014/1, dated 05-06-2014.

As per Govt. of Assam rules, there is a provision for reservation of seats for SC, ST(P), ST(H), OBC/MOBC, Differently abled candidates belonging to the State of Assam seeking admission into colleges in different streams of Government and Provincialised Colleges of Assam. Moreover, Govt. of Assam has earmarked a maximum of 5% seats for outstanding Sports Persons, Wards of the employees of the colleges, NCC Cadets/Scouts & Guides, Persons with Proficiency in Cultural Activities. In compliance with the above rules/instructions/guidelines, the number of seats to be offered for admission for the academic session 2025-26 in different class/stream under each programme of study are hereby notified for general information.

Further, it is notified to all concerned that admission shall be on the basis of merit based on the marks obtained in the qualifying examination, subject to above reservation of seats, and that there shall be no discretionary Quota of Seats to be filled up by the Principal, Donor or any other authority.

CREDITS AND ATTENDANCE

Students who do not attend 75% of the total number of classes held in one academic session/semester will not be allowed to appear in the final examination.

Students who fail to attend their classes for a certain period on genuine and acceptable grounds must apply in writing to the Head of the Department concerned for consideration of exemption of the absence for the period, immediately after the absence.

EXAMINATION SYSTEM AS PER THE RTU

Apart from the *end-semester examinations* conducted by the University, there will be periodical—*semester examinations* (Sessional Examinations/class tests/etc.) as per the university academic calendar. **Appearance in both types of examinations is compulsory.**

In case a student fails in any one or more papers in an *end-semester* examination, he/she can reappear in all those papers with few restrictions.

A student can appear for betterment in any one of the major theory papers in the next similar examination if he/she secures passing marks in all papers. No betterment will be allowed in internal and practical examinations in any semester.

A student must pass all his/her semester examinations, including arrears and betterment within six academic sessions.

END SEMESTER EXAMINATION

The end-semester examination will be of 80% of the total marks allotted for a particular course. The end-semester examination shall be of 3 hours duration for a course of total marks exceeding 50. **For a student to pass a course, he/she has to pass both the Internal Assessment and End-Semester Examination separately.**

PROCEDURE AND GUIDELINES FOR ADMISSION

- (A) **The decision of the Admission Committee regarding admission will be final. The Admission Committee will, as need be, stipulate and notify supplementary guidelines regarding restrictions in respect of combination of subjects and criteria of eligibility for admission**
- (B) **Eligibility for Admission - Higher Secondary:**

Candidates who have passed the HSLC Exam. of the Board of Secondary Education, Assam or any other equivalent Exam. recognised by the Assam Higher Secondary Education Council (AH

SEC) are eligible for admission to Higher Secondary First Year course provided that:

- (i) A candidate seeking admission to HS Science must have secured at least 45 % marks on aggregate in the HSLC or its equivalent Exam.
- (ii) Candidates belonging to SC, ST, OBC, MOBC and physically challenged categories are entitled to a relaxation of 5% of marks for admission to HS Science Course.
- (iii) Students, who wish to take up Economics, Mathematics and Statistics as combination, must have secured at least 45 % marks on aggregate in HSLC or its equivalent Examinations. They will be allowed to take only CSA as 4th subject.
- (iv) Students declared to have passed HS First Year Exam. by the College / AHSEC, Assam, are eligible for admission to HS Second Year.

GUIDELINES FOR ADMISSION:

ADMISSION NOTIFICATION OF H.S. 1st Yr. and UG 1st Semester 2025-26

Following are the compulsory steps to apply for Admission into H.S. 1st Yr. Science/Arts/Commerce classes.

1. Firstly, AHSEC, online portal “**DARPAN**” Link - **www.darpan.ahseconline.in** or **www.ahsec.assam.gov.in** from Date of online Admission Form fill up will start from 09- 06-2022.
2. Secondly, the candidates can be able to select five schools or colleges of their choice.
3. Thirdly, they shall be admitted to any of the selected institutions on the basis of their HSLC marks.

4. CRITERIA FOR ADMISSION TO MAJOR COURSES SHALL BE AS FOLLOWS:

At least 40% of Marks on the aggregate and also in the subject concerned in the H.S. Final or its equivalent examination (only theory)

(In case of Geology Major in above criteria is not applicable)

Guidelines for e-form fill-up for Degree 1st Semester:

Students seeking admission in Degree 1st semester for the Session 2023-24 are hereby advised to go through these Guidelines carefully before filling the e-form. Due to the

implementation of the new FYUGP by Gauhati University and Rabindranath Tagore University, subject combinations and course structure have changed from previous years. Students have to choose subjects very carefully as they will not be allowed to change subjects later on and the wrong combination of subjects may lead to cancellation of his/her application form. For any query, relating to the Degree 1st Semester form fill up, students can contact the college authority at working hours.

- * As per Govt. order letter no PC/HE/Misc./42/2020/35 dt. 7/08/2021 interested students are requested to use Unique ID to be generated by desired students in web portal of Director of Higher Education, Assam for Online Admission to avoid duplicate data and multiple admissions. (As per Govt. rule from time to time)

Important Instructions:

1. Admission to HS/UG will be made purely on merit (percentage of marks secured in the qualifying examination) basis subject to the rules and regulations of the Assam State School Education Board, Division II, Bamunimaidam, Guwahati - 781021, Assam (ASSEB)/ RTU, Hojai.
2. All admissions to HS/UG are provisional subject to the approval of ASSEB/RTU.
3. Candidates who have passed the qualifying examination in the year prior to 2025 must submit GAP PERIOD CERTIFICATE, issued by the Head of the Educational Institution last studied/Gazetted officer/registered medical practitioner.
4. The College reserves seats for students belonging to SC, ST(P), ST(H), OBC, and MOBC categories from the state of Assam as per Government rules. These seats are allotted to candidates on the basis of original certificates issued by Competent Authorities.
5. Admission to the college girls' hostel will be held immediately after the college admission, for which a separate application in the prescribed form is to be submitted. Admission will be strictly on a merit basis.
6. 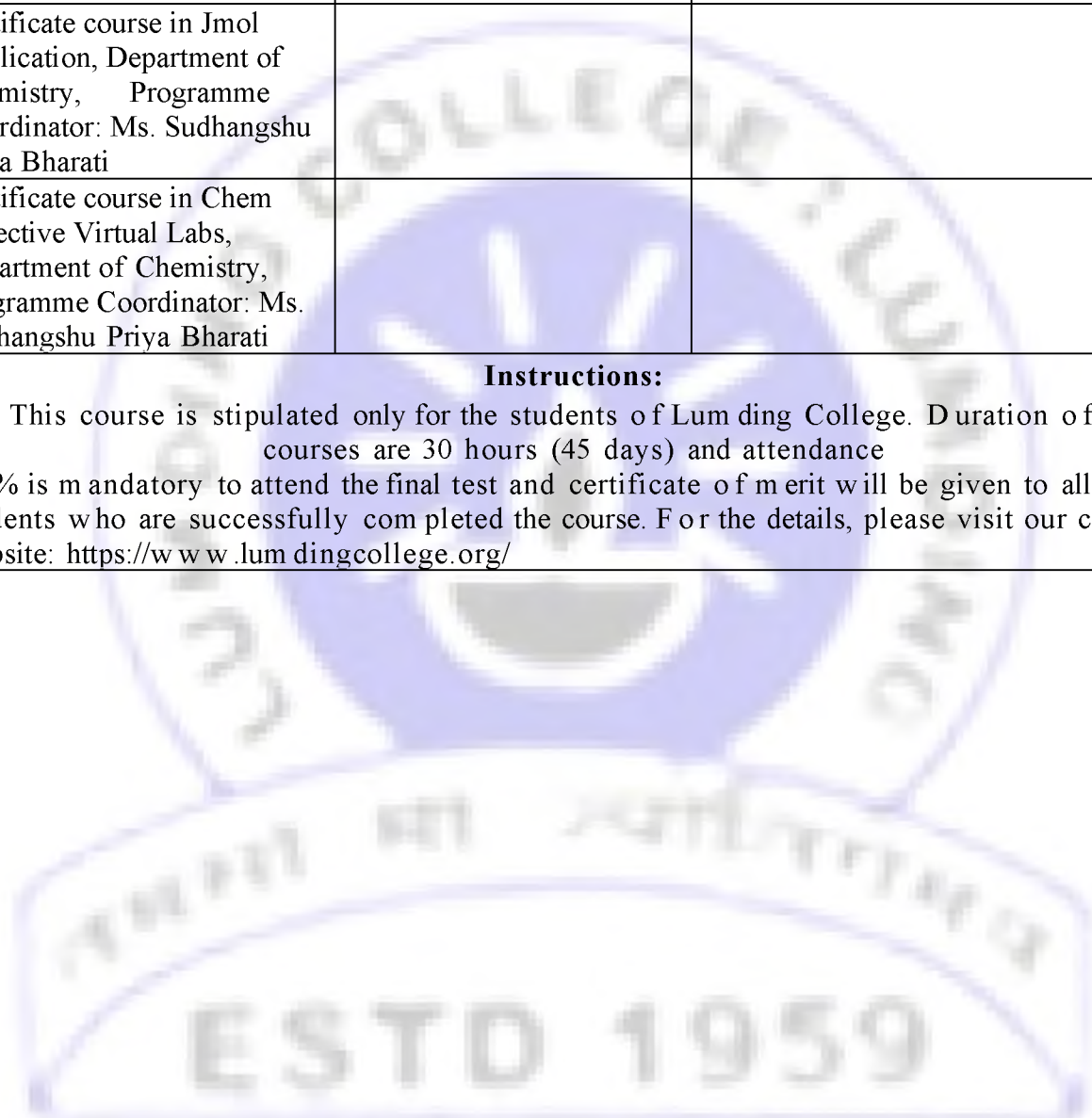
