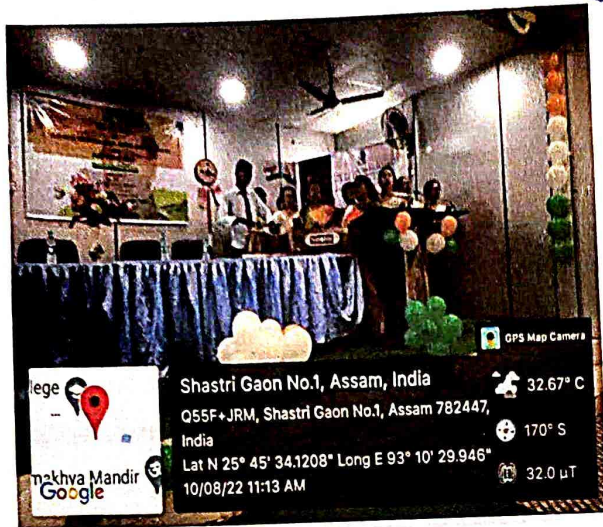
The inaugural ceremony of the series of programmes to be conducted from 10th to 15th August, 2022 under the initiative of the Government of India 'Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav', took place on 10th of August, 2022 at the seminar hall of Lumding College. The Department of History, Lumding College in association with IQAC, Lumding College also organized a programme of one-day talk on 'Subhash Chandra Bose: Indian National Army and Northeast India' on the same day, as a part of the five days programme. The invited speaker for the occasion was Dr. Sagar Baruah, Retired Principal of Khagarijan College and also a member of Governing Body of Lumding

College nominated by Gauhati University.

The other guests invited on the occasion were Sri Amar Gautam, Academic Registrar-in-charge and Associate Professor of Rabindranath Tagore University, Hojai, and Sri Prithwiraj Dutta, President of Governing Body of Lumding College.

The programme hosted by Dr. Manash Mazumder from the Department of History, began with a chorus sung by the members of Cultural and Literary Activities Committee, IQAC and Women Cell, ACTA unit of the college.





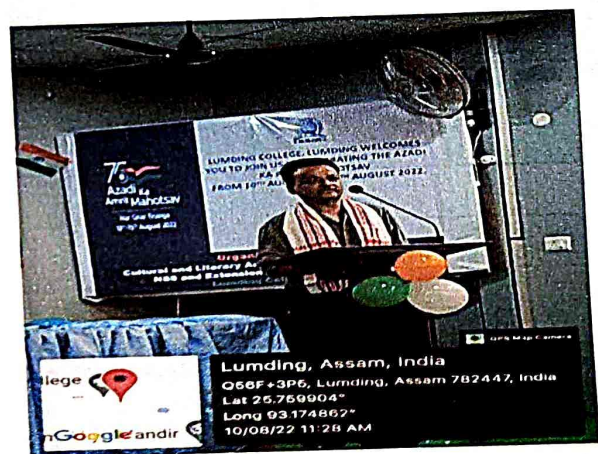

Right after that the invited speaker Dr. Sagar Baruah, the Principal of the College Dr. Mrinal Kanti Paul, IQAC coordinator Dr. Sanjay Kanti Das and HOD of History Department Dr. Parashu Upadhyay were requested to take their respective seats on the stage. They were duly felicitated with the Assamese traditional gamusa and were also presented with one National flag of India each, followed by which they were called forth to light the ceremonial lamp.

Next Prof. Parashu Upadhyay was called upon to deliver an inaugural speech. In his speech, Prof. Upadhyay extended his heartfelt gratitude to the guests for gracing the event with their presence and also briefly put forth the objective behind organizing the programme.

After the speech by Prof. Parashu Upadhyay, Dr. Sagar Baruah, the invited speaker of the one-day talk was called forward to deliver his talk. He spoke on the contribution of Subhash Chandra Bose in the





struggle for India's independence and the formation of the Indian National Army under his leadership. He also explained Bose's role in bringing North-east India to the focus of the centre. He also elaborated how Subhash Chandra Bose was one of the first nationalist leaders in pre-independent India to set for Northeast India, 3 years prior to India's Independence in 1944 and how he brought the focus on the Northeast region in the Indian National Movement. His decision to enter the Northeast region and Burma (Myanmar) was a well-planned strategy.

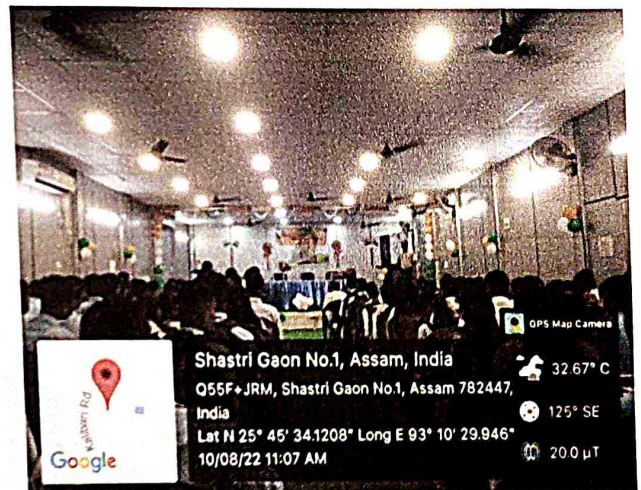

DAY 2- CELEBRATION OF THE "AZADI KA AMRIT MAHOTSAV"

The second day i.e. 11th August, 2022 of the week-long celebration of the "Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav" started at 10.30 a.m. when Lumding College fraternity gathered in front of the college for the "Har Ghar Tiranga





Campaign". The campaign was initiated by NSS & Extension Activity Cell, IQAC, Lumding College, in which more than 150 participants including NSS volunteers, students and faculty members of Lumding College covered a huge area including Kalibari, Main bazar and Railway colony. The main purpose of the campaign was to build awareness and to create buzz among common citizen with specific call to action on buying/ hoisting of Tiranga during 13th - 15th August/gifting a flag. The participants were joined by Sri Sibu Misra, MLA, 92 Lumding Legislative Assembly Constituency. During the campaign, national flags were gifted to street vegetable vendors. Then, the participants visited Lumding Police Station and gifted a national flag to the Officer in Charge, Lumding PS. In order to reach more people, a street drama was performed by the NSS volunteers, Lumding College in the main bazar, Lumding. In the end, the participants returned to the college premise and light refreshments were distributed among them. 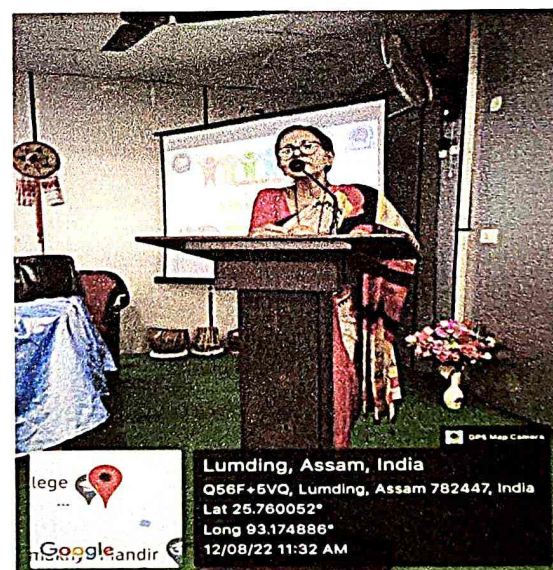
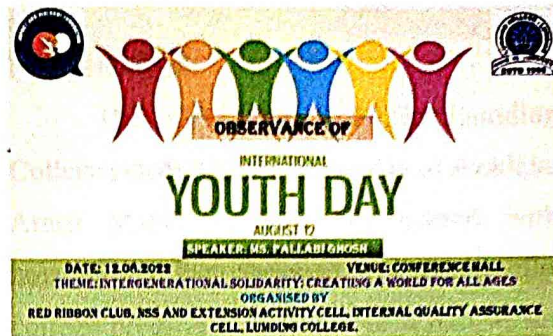

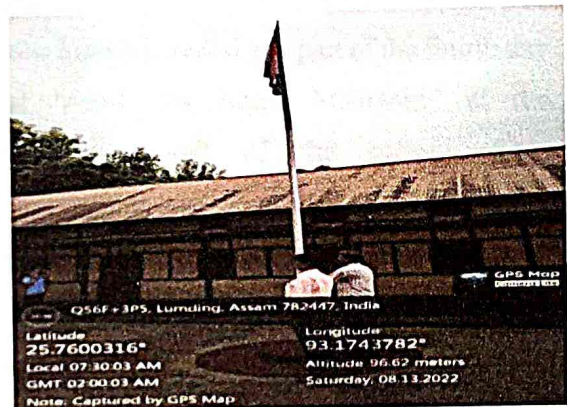


4TH DAY OF AZADI KA AMRIT MAHOTSAV

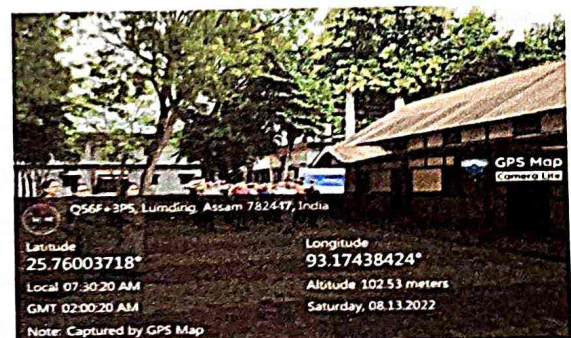

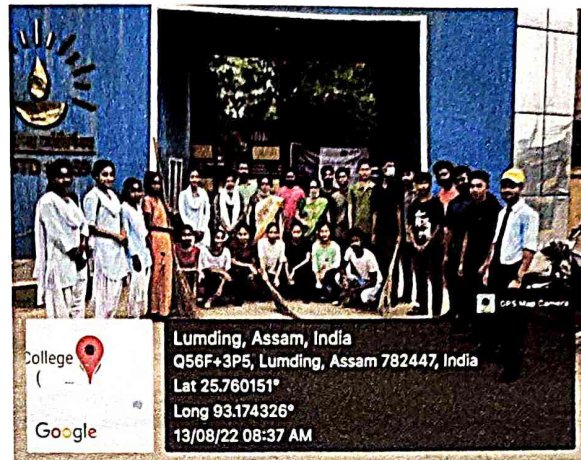

After that there was a cleanliness drive conducted by the Cleanliness



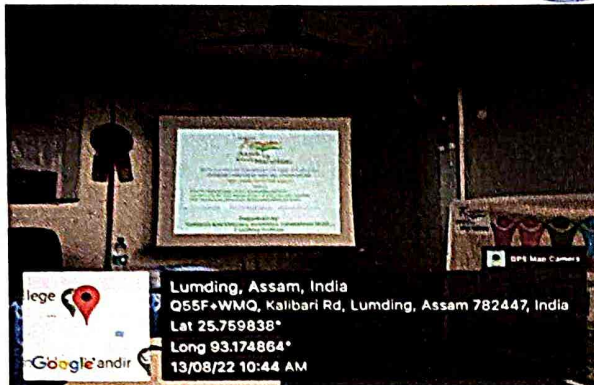

Dr. Gitanjali Nath, HoD, Department of Assamese and the convener of the Cleanliness Committee, coordinated the drive. At the beginning free masks were distributed among the participants. The drive began with the sweeping of classrooms by students. There was also cleaning of the conference hall, the toilets and the open space at the front of the college. After the drive ended, light refreshments were distributed amongst the participants.



An Essay writing and a drawing competition for the HS and UG students had also been scheduled as a part of the fourth day of 'Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav' at the conference hall of the college. 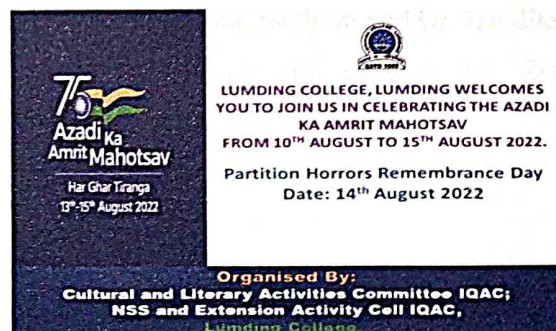

Day 5th: OBSERVANCE OF PARTITION HORRORS REMEMBRANCE DAY

As a part of the fifth day of the celebration of 'Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav', Lumding College observed the Partition Horrors Remembrance Day. It is a national memorial day in India observed on 14th of August, first declared by Prime Minister Narendra Modi in 2021, that commemorates the victims and sufferings of people during partition of India.



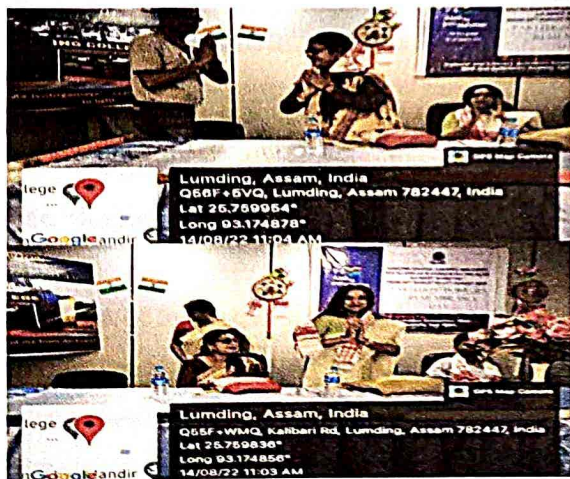
Two key speakers were invited on the occasion. One was Dr. Mousumi





Chowdhury, Associate Professor, Department of Political Science, Diphu Government College and the other speaker was Ms. Sumita Debnath, Assistant Professor, Department of Political Science, Hojai Girls' College.

The programme hosted by Dr. Bandita Teronpi from the Department of Political Science, Lumding College commenced at 10:30 am at the conference hall of the college. At first the guests, along with Principal of the college, Dr. Mrinal Kanti Paul, Governing Body President Shri Prithviraj Dutta and Prof. Parashu Upadhyay, HoD, Department of History were asked to take their respective seats on the dais after which they were duly felicitated with the Assamese traditional gamusa.

Next, Prof. Parashu Upadhyay was invited over to give the welcome note on the occasion. He welcomed everyone and stated the objectives of the programme. After his speech, Dr. Mrinal Kanti Paul was called forward to address the audience with a short speech. Next, Shri Prithviraj Dutta delivered a speech on the occasion. Also, as directed by the UGC, there was a show of the sufferings of the partition affected people through an exhibition that has been jointly curated by the Indian Council of Historical Research (ICHR) and Indira Gandhi National Centre for the Arts (IGNCA). This show was presented on digital medium and Dr. Bandita Teronpi, read out and pointed out the important parts of the exhibition.

After that, the first speaker of the day, Ms. Sumita Debnath was called forth for a speech. She gave a brief history of the partition of India, throwing light on the series of struggles since 1857 to 1947. She also highlighted the struggles of various freedom fighters involved in the struggle for India's independence. She briefly explained the effects of partition on the common people

and its aftermath which still can be seen today.



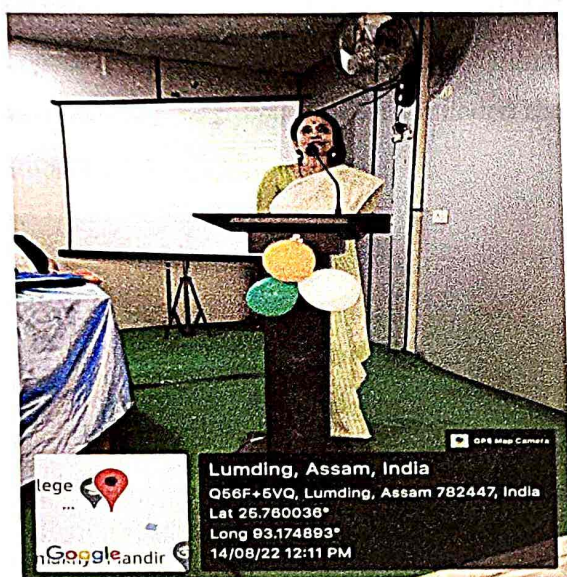

The next speaker of the day, Dr. Mousumi Chowdhury, gave a presentation titled 'Dealing with the horrors of partition and its impact on North-East India with special reference to forced migration and trauma of the refugees of the Barak Valley of Assam.' She mainly focused on the horrors of partition of 1947 that had to be faced by the people of Barak Valley, which remains a unique component in the history of Partition. Dr. Chowdhury extensively explained how a major displacement of people took place after the referendum in Sylhet district on 6th and 7th July, 1947 and how while Punjab and Bengal were divided on the basis of religion, the Sylhet referendum was a vote not on one, but



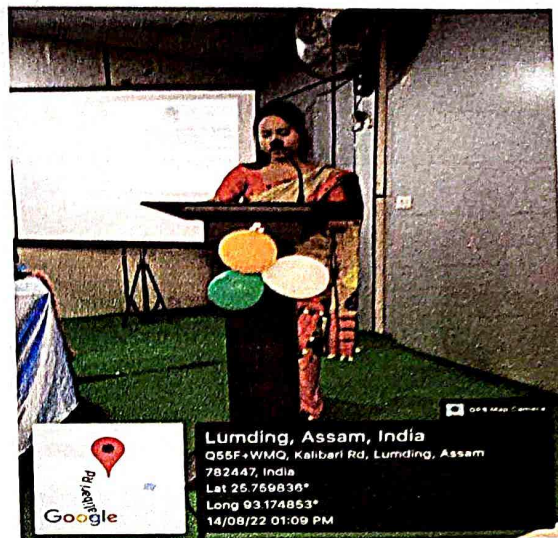


on two convergent subjects of realignment- of India on a communal basis and of Assam on a linguistic basis. Sylhet, which was a part of Assam, opted to join Pakistan, with only the Karimganj region remaining in India. She threw light on the geopolitical realities and lived experiences of people residing here in the post partition phase as refugees.

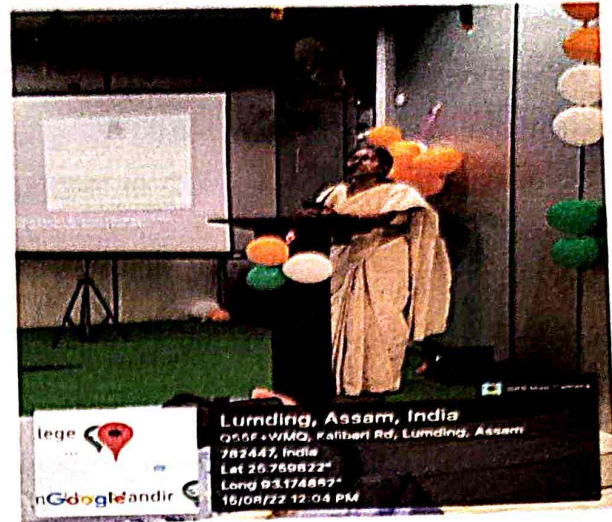

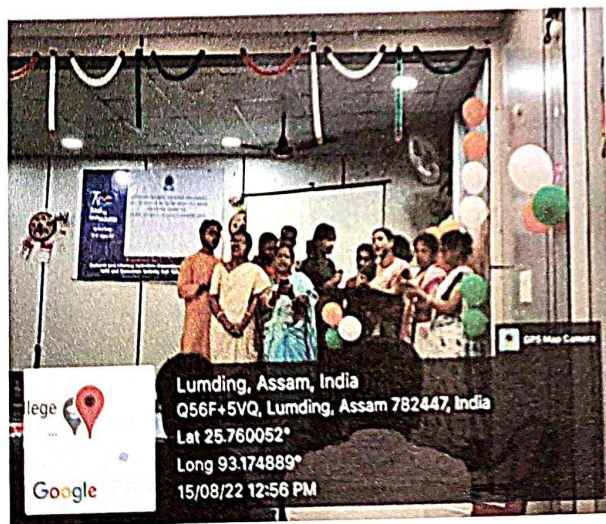
