



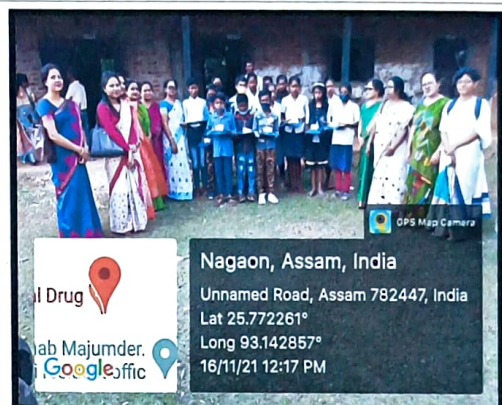
OBSERVANCE OF CHILDREN'S DAY AT RAJIV GANDHI MEMORIAL M.E. SCHOOL

The Women Cell of Lumding College, ACTA Unit, on the 16th of November, 2021, observed the Children's Day at Rajiv Gandhi Memorial M.E. School. Located in No. 1 Hatikhuli, Rajiv Gandhi Memorial M.E. School is the only Bengali Medium school in the area. It was established in the year 1991 with Laxmi Sarkar as its first Headmistress. At present the school has strength of 35 students and 6 teachers.

11 members of the Women Cell reached the school premises at around 11 am and were warmly welcomed by the Headmaster of the school Mr. Sintu Kumar Aich, Mr. Manik Das, a subject teacher of Assamese and a group of 15 students.

He talked in brief about the history of the school and also expressed his grief at the current condition of the school. True indeed, as observed by the members of the Women Cell too, the school is deprived of bare minimum facilities.
