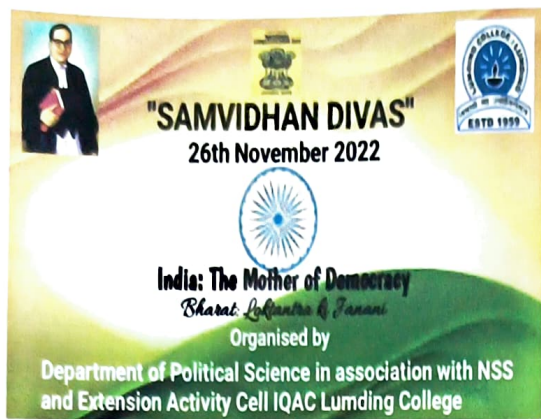




REPORT ON OBSERVANCE OF CONSTITUTION DAY, 2022



The Constitution Day is celebrated on **November 26** to commemorate the adoption of the Constitution of India. The Constituent Assembly of India adopted the Constitution of India on this day in 1949, which came into effect on January 26, 1950. This year, too, Lumding College observed this historic day along with the whole nation. UGC and District Administration instructed to observe the Samvidhan Divas. Samvidhan Divas is celebrated in India on 26th November every year to commemorate the adoption of the Constitution of India. The Indian democracy marching ahead in its 75th year, on the strengths of inclusiveness and diversity, is not only the world's largest democracy but also the mother of democracy. There are ample pieces of evidence, right from the Vedic period, that emphasizes the democratic traditions of

India. It has been, therefore, decided that this year's Constitution Day may be celebrated by organizing lectures on the theme "India: The Mother of Democracy". For this, Lumding College fraternity gathered at the college conference hall at 10.50 a.m. The program was organized by Department of Political Science, Lumding College and NSS & Extension Activity Cell, IQAC, Lumding College with a number of events. Reading out the Preamble to the Constitution at 11 AM. Reading out the Fundamental Duties in the Constitution during special Assembly and conducting special assembly on the importance of Fundamental Duties and Pasting of Fundamental Duties on the Notice Board of the Institution. At 11.00 a.m., Dr. Bandita Teronpi, Assistant Professor, Department of Political Science, Lumding College read aloud the Preamble of the Constitution of India, which was joined by everyone present in the conference hall with honor and pride. 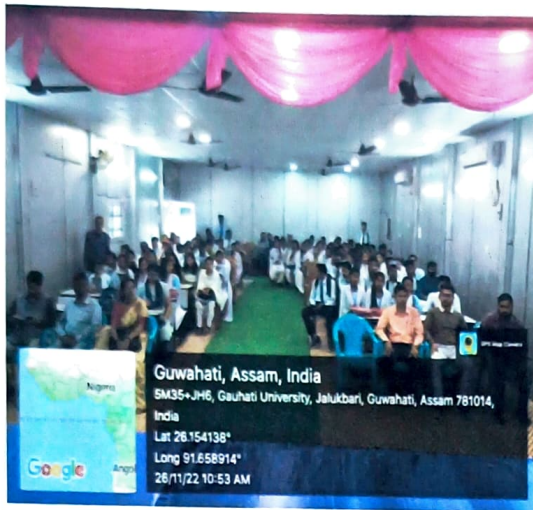

Picture: College fraternity gathered for observing the Constitution Day.

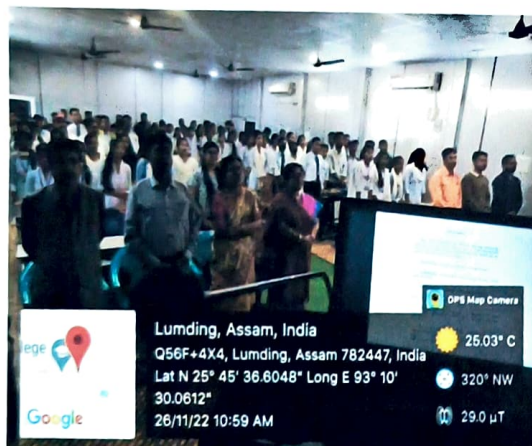

It was followed by a speech by Ms. Sarbani Sengupta, B. A.
