**SPECIAL ASSEMBLY ON HAR GHAR TIRANGA AND MERI MATI
MERA DESH**

On August 12, 2023, Lumding College hosted a special assembly titled "Meri Maati Mera Desh" and "Har Ghar Tiranga" as part of the Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav celebrations. The event was a collaborative effort organized by the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC), the National Service Scheme (NSS), and the Extension Activity Cell of Lumding College. It commenced at 2 pm in the college's conference hall.

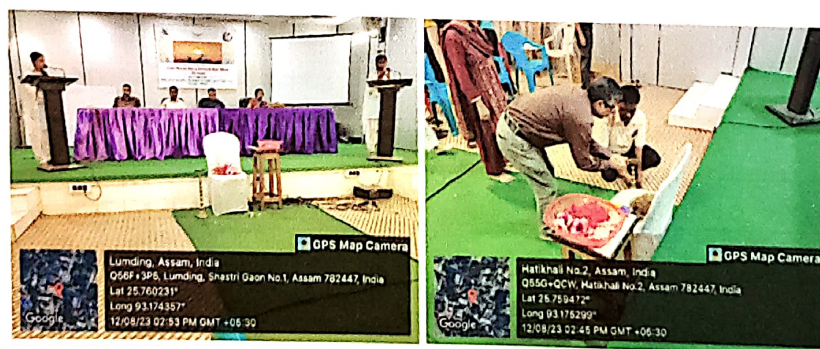
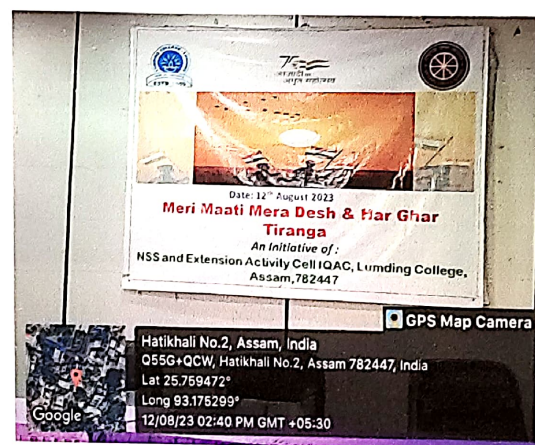
Mahotsav, which seeks to celebrate 75 years of India's independence by recognizing its achievements and envisioning a bright future.

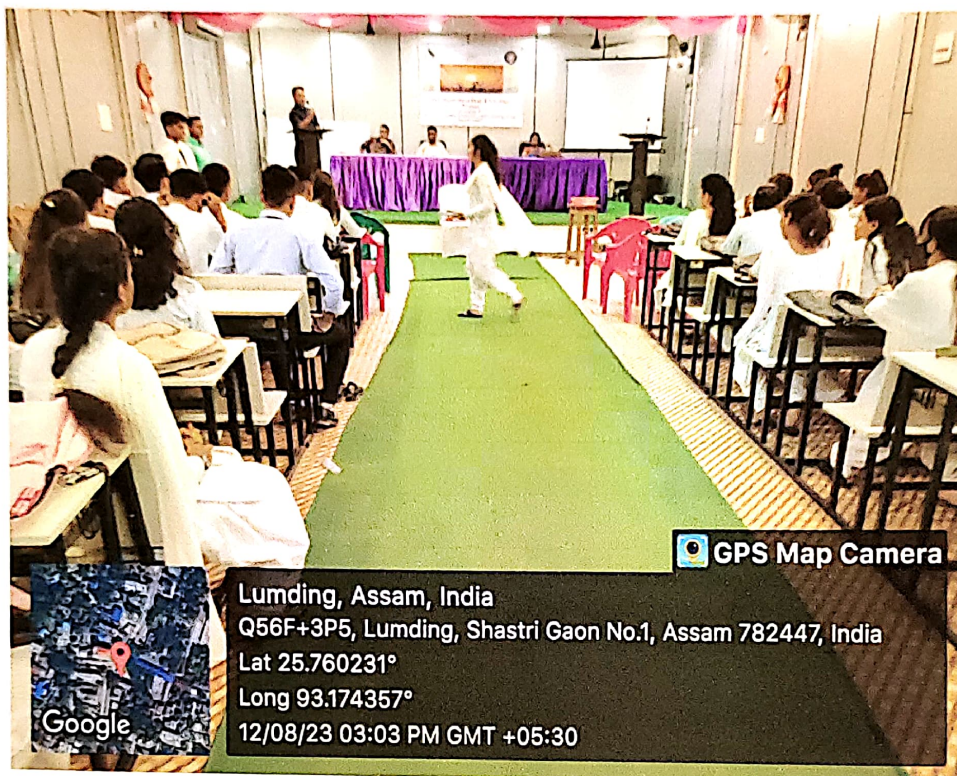
